

Social Work Licensure Compact Commission Announces Data System Development Partnership

The Social Work Licensure Compact Commission, doing business as SWICC, is pleased to announce the launch of its new Compact data system, to be developed in partnership with [InspiringApps](#).

The Commission is the joint governmental agency of the member states party to the Social Work Licensure Compact, charged with administering the Compact and overseeing the issuance of multistate licenses for qualified social workers.

The selection of InspiringApps followed the Commission's comprehensive Request for Proposal process, which invited qualified vendors to submit proposals for development of the data system. Each submission was reviewed and evaluated for alignment with the Commission's operational needs, technical requirements, and core values. Final vendor selection was determined by a vote of the full Commission.

InspiringApps, established in 2007, brings experience in compact-related technology development, including prior work on multistate licensure data systems. The Commission is confident in InspiringApps as the right partner to build and support this system.

The new data system will provide licensed social workers with the ability to apply for multistate licenses in their home state, practice in compact states, access their accounts, and view important information such as fees, holds, and changes to their multistate license status. The system will also enable secure data sharing between member states to improve efficiency, strengthen communication, and enhance public safety.

Development is estimated to take approximately nine months, with progress reported to the Commission through regular sprint reviews.

The Commission thanks its member states and looks forward to this partnership with InspiringApps.
