10:00am- 10:02am Welcome & Call to Order Chair

- The Chair called the meeting to order at 10:02am ET.
- Daniel Logsdon, Kaitlyn Bison and Imani Smith (CSG), and Samantha Nance (Interim Legal Counsel) are present.

10:05am – 10:10am Review and Adopt Agenda* Chair

- David Fye requested work on a new rule for topic of discussion.
 - Legal Counsel offered to add rule during delegate comments portion.
- David Fye moved to adopt the agenda, Youa Yang seconded. Motion carried.

10:05am – 10:15am Review and Adopt Draft Meeting Minutes* Chair

- David Fye moved to approve minutes, Youa Yang seconded. Motion carried.

10:15am – 10:40am Discussion: Draft Rule on Transfer of Home State Chair/Interim Legal Counsel

- Legal Counsel reviewed additions and comments included in the rule, as well as portions for clarification.
 - Addition of definitions for “new home state”, “prior home state” and “provisional multistate authorization to practice”

- Additions to Section 2.1, regarding timeline for submissions by licensee and process for license reissuance by the data system.

- Legal Counsel asked a question on the Home State portal regarding section 2.4 and state reporting, concerning the process for reissuances. The Chair and David Fye recalled that the licensee wouldn't be reporting, but that it would be taking place at the state level.
- Legal Counsel noted that 2.4 would notify of the review process as an interface from the new home state.
 - David Fye noted that the onus would belong to the new home state would review the new license for determining and reporting if the license is approved.
- Legal Counsel noted additions to the new Section 3 "Verification by the New Home State" (formerly 4), including cross reference with Section 2 for process of reissuance, declining of reissuance and deactivation of multistate licenses.
- Legal Counsel reviewed Section 5.2 and asked question regarding adding language on reissuance denial.
 - Legal Counsel proposes striking Section 5.2 (A).
 - Kaitlyn Bison and Legal counsel clarify data system's order for inactivation of multistate licenses and prior home state reporting.
 - Legal counsel asked a question on the timeline process for a number of days for reporting on inactivation.
 - The Chair notes previous comments from Angela Fileccia for previous Joint Finance/Rules Committees Meeting regarding the number of days provision.
 - Kaitlyn Bison notes Fileccia's request for 30 days.
 - Youa Yang asked if prior home state reporting would inhibit the new home state's reporting.
 - Kaitlyn Bison clarified it should delay the process. Yang noted that with the new home state designation and multistate license, it would be a matter of correct reporting.

Legal Counsel reiterated that it would depend on correct reporting between states.

- David Fye asked if a scenario where there is an undetermined home state causing multiple states of licensure might exist and should be considered.
 - Legal Counsel noted that licensee home state and other state licensure would be visible. Allowing overrides in the system per the most recent reporting.
- The Chair proposes addition to Section 6.1 (A) for verifying accuracy of data system states reportings.
- David Fye moves to change reference in Section 6.1 from 5 business days to 15 calendar days as stipulation, with friendly amendment for “Business days” addition from Youa Yang. Motion carried.
- David Fye asked about limiting frequency of reestablishing a new home state and provides reasoning for proposal. The Chair asked if that measure may inhibit military families.
 - Kaitlyn Bison clarified that there is special consideration for military families, allowing them to maintain the previous home state.
 - Legal Counsel noted balancing administrative costs for most frequent reestablishing new home states.
 - David Fye proposed holding on consideration for a later rule per occurrences within the data system with licensees.
- David Fye asked question on Section 4.1-4.2 language and the need for new background checks for reissuing per earlier background check.
 - The Chair notes process in some states and requirements for applications.

- Legal Counsel reiterates language may re-require a redone background check, as it is not considered continual or “rolling”.
 - David Fye asked about potential matching of the language to the model language for Section 4.2-4.3.
 - Youa Yang noted that she prefers the language in Section 7 on frequency of criminal background checks per a procedure of length of time from the last background check.
 - David Fye moved to adopt language added by Legal Counsel; Youa Yang seconded. Motion Carried.
- Legal Counsel proposed advancing the rule to the next Executive Committee section, allowing for remaining week to finalize and clean up the draft per review of members. Translated to a motion.
 - Youa Yang made the motion, David Fye seconded. Motion carried.

10:40am – 11:20am

Discussion: Draft Rule on Adverse Actions

Chair/Interim Legal Counsel

- The Chair proposed to table the draft rule, per the need of substantial review by the committee.
 - Legal Counsel proposes not tabling the draft rule as it may remove from discussion, but continuing review and discussion for the next Rules Committee meeting; notes technical provisions, and definitions needing review and consideration of the data system.
 - Chair agrees and reiterates hope to submit multiple draft rules for consideration to the Full Commission.

Delegate Questions and Comments

Chair

- David Fye noted background check requirements per state launches. Potential for advancing a “grace period” rule for instituting the requirement for a full, compliant launch, as seen previously with PSYPACT compact.
 - Daniel Logsdon (CSG) notes “grace period” was a part of the statute for PSYPACT, and legal impossibility in OT/etc, compacts. Noted CSG will collect information on the matter.

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- Legal Counsel noted that it is a matter of if background check is a licensee or state requirement. Agreed that matter should be a prioritized discussion. David Fye noted hope for unified requirements.
- Kaitlyn Bison noted examples in other compacts for sharing with committee members.
- The Chair noted that matter may be the best discussion for a full commission meeting for getting direct feedback collection from states represented by commissioners involved.
 - Noted net discussions should be regarding draft rules on Adverse Action, Background Check information, and Fees.
 - Noted potential addition of Kelli Willis. Kaitlyn Bison noted her nomination would come from Commission Chair and then Willis would be added.
 - Youa Yang asked about other requirements in other jurisdictions with background checks for single state licenses. David Fye noted that collecting information would be helpful towards establishing a rule.
 - The Chair recalls previous requirement for background checks as a part of compact model language.
 - Legal Counsel noted the drafting process and uniformity. Kaitlyn bison proposes gathering the information and issuing a survey.
- The chair asked if ASWB does collect that state background check information. Cara Sanner (ASWB) noted that they do and will share with the committee after verification.
